

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WHAT IS COMMUNITY MAPPING?






- A way of thinking about resources in your community that make life meaningful
- Person centered planning and inclusion are the foundation
- Uses close social ties and distant social ties to identify potential connections
- A good community map will:
 - o create a visual chart of what exists in the community
 - expand expectations
 - o lead to relationship building







Work with the student to conduct these two activities as a way to practice their effective communication, self-awareness, and leadership skills.


